**Friday Program Options –**

**Legend’s Hike –** Is a 6 mile hike around the scout ranch and surrounding areas. There are stories that are told along the way. The stories depict the rich history around the scout ranch and history of the Spanish Peaks. Great hike for any scout, with lots of great views.
